Focus Area	F1: Green Productivity for Sustainable Transformation Green Productivity mainstreamed across industrial and agricultural sectors, integrating sustainability, innovation, and capacity development to achieve measurable gains in productivity and environmental performance.
Primary Key Results	Pillar 2: Strategic Planning Support Specific GP roadmaps for assisted enterprises have been developed, integrating productivity, circular economy principles, and sustainable development goals (SDGs).
Indicator	Number of APO member economies participated in the program, with a minimum attendance rate of 80% per participant. Baseline: 0 Target: 10 participants from APO members, each with 80% minimum attendance.
Description	Amid accelerating climate change and the global transition toward sustainability, GP and net-zero development have emerged as strategic priorities. However, member economies remain at different stages of green technology adoption, decarbonization, and policy implementation, with limited opportunities for systematic knowledge exchange. The enterprises, especially SMEs across the Asia-Pacific, need to explore and adopt approaches such as resource efficiency, circular economy, and carbon accounting and management while navigating the volatile business dynamics and aligning operations with net-zero emission plans at national level. This workshop aims to strengthen understanding of GP and net-zero frameworks through thematic sessions and international case studies, while fostering integrated strategies for sustainable, low-carbon, and resilient economic development. It will further enhance participants' understanding and practical capabilities in applying GP 2.0 approaches to support circular economy developments and net-zero transition.
Topics	GP 2.0; Low-carbon Transformation Strategies; Circular Economy; Resource Efficiency; Carbon Management and Clean Technology Applications; Site Visits; Strategic Roadmap Building; and Action Planning.
Qualifications	Policymakers, government officials, NPO personnel, industry representatives, sustainability practitioners, researchers, and professionals working in areas related to GP, climate action, decarbonization, energy efficiency, and net-zero initiatives. Participants should have at least three years of relevant experience, be responsible for policy or program implementation, and be able to apply and disseminate the knowledge gained. Proficiency in written and spoken English is required.
